        System.out.println("those who know binary and those who don't.");
   }
}
```

3. What does the following output to the console?

```
public class Exercise {
   public static void main(String[] args) {
        System.out.println("And on");
        System.out.println(" and on");
        System.out.print(" and on");
        System.out.print(" and on");
    }
}
```

4. Circle all of the following that are properly formatted strings.

```
